Family Child Care Homes – Outdoor Safety Checklist

The home must provide outdoor daily outdoor play for all ages of children***Weather permitting

GENERAL

I here must be at least /5 sq feet of useable outdoor play space for each child
Play space must have a 42 inch fence or natural barrier*
All parts of the play area must be visible and easily supervised
Shade must be available
Decks 12 inches or higher must have a protective barrier or railing
SLATS on railing must be no more than 4 inches apart
Areas under deck must be inaccessible to children
Tiered yards higher than 12 inches must have railing or protective barrier
Outdoor area must be free of all animal contamination/waste
Window wells must have protective cover
Outdoor play areas are free of lawn mowers, tools, propane, building/metal scraps
Grills must be covered and Propane must be OFF
Walkways must be cleared of snow and ice
Check area for trash, debris, foreign materials, and cracked/broken toys & equipmentCheck for tripping hazards (weed mat, wires, etc)
WATER AREAS
Swimming pools, above ground pools and permanent wading pool must be locked
and enclosed with a 5 foot fence
Hot tubs must be secured and locked
Decorative ponds must have child proof gates to prevent drowning
Children must be directly and actively supervision near standing water
EQUIPMENT
Tree houses must be inaccessible to children in care
Trampolines must be totally inaccessible to children. **USE IS PROHIBITED
NO MOTORIZED riding toys are allowed
Helmets, Wrist protection, Knee and Elbow pads for scooters, bicycles, skateboards
and rollerblades.
Permanent climbing equipment must have at least 4 inches of protective surface
**BY 12/31/10- there must be at least 6 inches or protective surface
Sand may be used as a protective surface when regularly raked
***If sand is compacted or lost resiliency or depth, the provider shall
immediately comply with a plan to replace the sand with another approved
protective surface. When surfacing becomes frozen equipment must be off
limits until resiliency can be re-established
All Portable climbing equipment over two feet in height must have protective surface
Swing sets and permanent climbing equipment must meet the Fall Zone requirements
